ARNSW Supports Delegate to WRC-2019

The World Radio Conference (WRC) of the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) is scheduled for later this year (28 Oct thru 22 Nov). It will be held at Sharm el-Sheikh in Egypt. Conferences are held every three to four years and are hosted by different countries each time. The previous Conference was in Geneva, Switzerland during 2015. Most nations in the world are attendees.

It is at these conferences that agreements on the use of radio spectrum are hammered out. They also manage agreements on the orbits of various geo-stationery and other satellites. There is continual



competition for access to spectrum space and, as you might imagine, our Amateur allocations often come under scrutiny. It is in our interest to keep a close eye on proceedings and to have input to discussions when and where possible.

To this end the W.I.A., the national body representing amateurs within Australia will be, at the invitation of the Australian government, sending a delegate to the Conference. As expected, such an operation is not without considerable cost. It is imperative, though, that

we be represented and so ARNSW are assisting with a donation of \$5,000.00 towards expenses. W.I.A. President Greg – VK2GPK was presented with a cheque for the amount during his visit to Dural on 28 Jul 19. Pictured is Greg together with ARNSW President Mat – VK2YAP receiving the cheque.
