Solar flare activity was very low all week.

However, Geomagnetic activity observed for the Australian region, was quiet to unsettled on the 21st, ranging to major storm levels on the 22nd. Activity settled throughout the week however, with quiet to minor storm conditions observed on the 23rd, quiet to active on the 24th, quiet to unsettled on the 25th and 26th, then quiet conditions on the 27th.

F2 critical frequencies in the southern Australian region, were depressed 15% during local day on the 21st but recovered to near predicted during local night. The 22nd remained near predicted, and the 23rd was mostly near predicted except for depressions of up to 20% after local dawn. The 24th was depressed 20% during local day, but near predicted at night, the 25th and 26th were both depressed 15% during the day, returning to near predicted at night, then the 27th returned to near predicted monthly values.

Now, the forecast for the 28th of April to the 4th of May;

Solar flare activity should be low.

Geomagnetic activity will be at quiet to unsettled levels.

Maximum Usable Frequencies should remain near predicted monthly values.

Illawarra Amateur Radio Society

The next meeting of the Society is on the 9th of May. The general meeting starts at 7:30pm, directly following the Committee meeting at 6:30pm.

The Society's meetings are at the Coniston Community Hall, Bridge Street Coniston, which is just a little south of the CBD of Wollongong. The hall is located right next door to the Coniston Railway Station, so access to meetings by train is very easy.

The next meeting will have a presentation and video from Club member Ned VK2AGV. Ned's had a varied career of past professions, at one stage being the radio operator on merchant vessels out of Australia. On one voyage he was docked in the South Pacific when a volcano erupted close by, creating a downfall of ashes with amazing sights. Ned videoed the voyage and edited a video which he has called "Out of the Ashes", giving a fascinating insight into merchant shipping, bulk carriers and an erupting volcano. As Ned is a passionate speaker with an in-depth understanding of his topic, this presentation should prove to be very interesting.

After Ned's presentation, raffle tickets will be available for purchase for the chance to win a full-featured soldering/desoldering reworking station, followed by the usual ragchew over a hot cuppa' and biscuits.

The VK2RUW repeater at Knights Hill on 146.675MHz, has returned to service after an extensive refit - from the repeater, through the duplexer, the feedline and antenna system, all on a new tower. The coverage appears to have improved greatly in all directions, with access from Narooma in the south, Goulburn to the south-west and Lithgow to the north west. The installation took considerable time and co-ordination as it had to be done to the professional required of the tower's owner.

ARNSW News Bulletins are now being relayed on three of the Society's repeaters; VK2RUW at Knights Hill as well as VK2RMP at Maddens Plains on both 6 metres, 53.65MHz and 2 metres on 146.85MHz. These three repeaters provide coverage over much of Sydney, Wollongong, the Southern Highlands and the Shoalhaven areas.

The Society is also trialling a Yaesu Fusion repeater on 438.725MHz at VK2RMP Maddens Plains. This 70 centimetre repeater operates with the usual 5MHz negative offset, with a 123Hz CTCSS access tone necessary for FM users. The repeater is operating in Auto Mode, so analogue FM transmissions are retransmitted in FM and digital C4FM signals retransmitted in C4FM. Any users of this new digital mode are invited to make use of this UHF repeater on 438.725.

Additionally, if you're interested in having a bit of a chinwag on Saturday mornings, Steve VK2BGL runs a very popular net on the VK2RMP and VK2RUW 2m repeaters, starting at 9.30am local. As these repeaters are also connected to Echolink, the Net receives call-ins from all over Australia, as well as many different other countries. So put the time of 9.30am in your diary & call-in next Saturday morning on either 2m repeater or on Echolink via VK2BGL-R.

To conclude, for a great evening of entertainment, fun and information, come along to the Illawarra Amateur Radio Society's next meeting at 7:30pm on May the 9th at the Coniston Community Hall in Wollongong.

Most radios allow either custom offsets, or have at least some memory channels that allow transmit and receive frequencies to be set independently of any default offset.
