Solar flare activity was low on the 18th and 19th. On the 20th, there was moderate activity with an M1.1 flare observed at 0153UT. Actiity was then low from the 21st to the 23rd, and very low on the 24th.

Geomagnetic activity in the Australian region, was quiet to unsettled on the 18th and 20th, quiet to active on the 19th and 22nd, quiet on the 21st, quiet to minor storm levels on the 23th, then back to quiet to unsettled on the 24th.

F2 critical frequencies in the southern Australian region, were near predicted values during local day on the 18th, though enhanced 25% during local night. Frequencies remained near predicted from the 19th through to the 21st. The 22nd and 23rd were near predicted during local day though enhanced 15% during local night, then the 24th saw near predicted values during local day, but depression of 15% during local night.

Now, the forecast for the 25th to the 31st of August;

Solar activity is expected to be low to moderate.

Geomagnetic activity is expected to be between quiet and unsettled levels.

Maximum Usable Frequencies should remain mostly near predicted monthly values.
