Solar flare activity was very low all week.

Geomagnetic activity in the Australian region was quiet on the 22nd, quiet to active on the 23rd, quiet to unsettled on the 24th, quiet to active on the 25th, quiet to minor storm levels on the 26th, then quiet on the 27th and 28th.

F2 critical frequencies in the southern Australian region, were near predicted monthly values on the 22nd. The 23rd and 24th were near predicted during daytime, with enhancements of 40% during local night. The 25th was mostly near predicted, the 26th was near predicted during the day and enhanced 20% at night, but the 27th saw depressions of 20% during the day, recovering to near predicted at night.
