In the news from Amateur Radio New South Wales for this week:

While some restrictions are still in place due to Covid-19, there are no events at VK2WI Dural for the month of May. The May Foundation course and the Trash and Treasure have been cancelled, and the ARNSW Radio Experimenter's group is planning an online meeting. However, many clubs and groups have increased on air activities and later in this bulletin, we have a summary of on air activities, from various groups in Sydney and across News South Wales.

We also welcome any updates on the progress in these activities; which we can report on VK2WI News, and tell listeners how it went.

We should also remind our listeners of some telephone services that are available, if you have health concerns at this time. The National COVID hotline is 1800 020 080, providing general advice; If you are feeling unwell, Healthdirect is on 1800 022 222. Both of these services are available 24 hours a day, and are a free call from most telephone services.

This year's Annual General Meeting of Amateur Radio New South Wales, took place yesterday on Saturday May 30th, via video conference. Starting at 11am, the meeting reached a quorum, with 33 members joining on line, on mobile devices, and via telephone dial-in.

After a brief period of familiarisation with the video conference environment, the meeting proceeded largely as normal. In all the meeting ran successfully, with the added benefit of allowing the participation of members who could not practically attend Dural, even under normal circumstances without travel restrictions. The Board of ARNSW will be considering how to continue to use similar technology for 'hybrid' meetings in the future.

ARNSW Radio Experimenters Group

The group usually meets at VK2WI Dural, after the bimonthly Trash & Treasure; but with restrictions continuing, the group is again having an online meeting via Skype.

Skype is a free download, available for almost all computers and smartphones. The link for the Skype group call is on the home page of the ARNSW website, arnsw.org.au. The link is already active if you want to test, but the meeting will start at noon AEST.

Some tips for those new to Skype; a headset with microphone will help your audio, but the computer's built in audio will often be ok; and it's a good idea to mute your audio when you are not talking.

The meeting will start with a bit of online help to get everyone's audio and video working, followed by some show and tell and discussion.

We will also try to record the audio and put it on the website, to be available for later download.

ARNSW HF Operations Group

Earlier this year, the ARNSW HF Operating Group commenced regular operations from the Dural site, on Mondays from 3pm through into the evening.

The group had to suspend activities due to Covid-19 restrictions, but as restrictions are being progressively lifted, the group is planning to resume operations in the coming weeks.

If you live in an apartment, or are still setting up your station, the group provides you with an opportunity to get on the air from Dural, using the club station VK2AWI.

Solar activity was very low all week. Geomagnetic activity reached unsettled levels on the 24th, but otherwise remained quiet.

F2 critical frequencies in the southern Australian region, remained mostly near predicted monthly values during daylight hours, all week. Night hours and immediately after local dawn, enhanced conditions were observed, compared to the predicted monthly values.

On conditions were enhanced 25% during local night on the 22nd, 30% during local night on the 23rd, and 45% during local night on the 24th. The 25th saw a very significant enhancement, with night frequencies enhanced by 100% relative to predicted monthly values, and 25% enhancement after local dawn. Enhancement continued during local night hours for the rest of the period, with 70% enhancement on the 26th, 45% on the 27th, and 20% during I local night on the 28th.

Now, the forecast for the 29th of May to the 4th of June;

Solar activity is expected to be very low

Geomagnetic activity is expected to be at quiet, to unsettled levels.

Maximum Usable Frequencies should be near predicted monthly values with some enhanced periods possible.
