Solar activity was at very low levels all week. Geomagnetic activity was at quiet levels all week.

F2 critical frequencies in the southern Australian region, remained near predicted monthly values during local daylight hours all week. Some enhanced propagation was observed; with 15% during local night on the 17th; 20% during local night and 35% after local dawn on the 18th; 30% during local night on the 19th; 15% during local night on the 20th; 30% during local night on the 22nd; and enhancement of 50% during local night on the 23rd.

Now, the forecast for the 24th to the 30th of July;

Solar activity is expected to be very low.

Geomagnetic activity is expected to be at quiet, to unsettled levels, though some isolated active periods are possible on the 24th of July.
