## Weekly Solar and Geophysical Report

For the period of the 17<sup>th</sup> to the 23<sup>rd</sup> of February. First, the summary of activity;

Solar activity was at R3 level on the 17<sup>th</sup>, with an X2.3 flare at 2017UTC. Activity was at R0 levels for the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, then R1 on the 20<sup>th</sup> with an M4.4 flare. The 21<sup>st</sup> was at R2 with three M-class flares, the 22<sup>nd</sup> at R1 with two M-class flares, and the 23<sup>rd</sup> was at R1, with three M-class flares.

Geomagnetic activity remained below warning threshold from the 17<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup>, then reached G1 on the 21<sup>st</sup>, returning to quiet conditions on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. Magnetometer data recorded a weak geomagnetic impulse of 12 nanoTesla, at 1036UTC on the 20<sup>th</sup>.

F2 critical frequencies in Southern Australia were enhanced by 20% during local night hours, and up to 35% on the 19<sup>th</sup>. During local daylight hours, there were also some periods of enhanced conditions – from 15 to 35% on the 19<sup>th</sup>; 15% on the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>; and 20% on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The forecast, issued on the 24<sup>th</sup> of February, through until the 2<sup>nd</sup> of March;

Solar activity is expected to be at R1 to R2 levels from the 24<sup>th</sup> to the 28<sup>th</sup>, then R0 to R1 on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of March. Geomagnetic conditions should mostly remain quiet. There is a possibility of G1 conditions form the 24<sup>th</sup> to the 28<sup>th</sup> due to coronal hole effects.

Maximum usable frequencies in the Australian region are expected to be near predicted monthly values, up to 15% enhanced; but mild depressions are possible from the 26<sup>th</sup> to the 28<sup>th</sup> if geomagnetic disturbance occurs.
