Daylight Saving Time started early this morning in southeastern Australia. Since VK2WI News bulletins maintain the same local time, the one-hour change may have an effect on HF propagation. Another alternative is EchoLink – and tonight, we are relayed on the EchoLink "HAM" conference, and the Australian & New Zealand EchoLink Network. Callbacks will also be taken after tonight's bulletin; our thanks to John VK3HJQ, and the Australian & New Zealand EchoLink Network team, for making this relay available.

#### Jamboree on the Air 2023

Since 1957, amateur radio has been used by Scouts, and more recently Girl Guides, to get together virtually, from anywhere in the world.

Running this year from Friday the 20<sup>th</sup> until Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of October, Jamboree on the Air, or JOTA, sees the amateur air waves are thrown open to youthful voices with enthusiasm to make new friends and exchange experiences. Contacts are made with other JOTA stations in the next suburb, interstate or overseas.

We mentioned last week the operation by the St George Amateur Radio Society, with VK2LE active from Boree Regatta across two days. We've been contacted by David VK2DU, with information on some additional JOTA stations in VK2;

- The Garigal and Northern Beaches Districts Scouts will be at Terrey Hills Public School, with JOTA call sign VK2SNR.
- Glenfield Scout Activity Centre is running JOTA activities for Scouts and Venturer Scouts, across the weekend, With two call signs – VK2SRA for GWS and VK2SHR for Hume. A Fusion Wires-X room 69904 will be active as well.
- On the 21<sup>st</sup>, the Blue Mountains Amateur Radio Club is hosting a oneday event for the younger Joey Scouts and Cub Scouts. The call sign is VK2HZ.
- And, At Berrima Scout Camp, the Hume Region Scout Fellowship is assisting with bringing JOTA to the Southern Highlands. The amateur radio activities will include HF radio, digital and other radio activities to reach Scouts from everywhere. Their call sign is VK2HU.

As in previous years, VK2WI will relay the official opening address on Saturday the 20th, on all VK2WI frequencies and through automated relays.

## Weekly Solar and Geophysical Report

For the period of the 22<sup>nd</sup> to the 28<sup>th</sup> of September. First, the summary of activity;

Solar activity was at R1 levels on the 22<sup>nd</sup> with three M-class flares; on the 23<sup>rd</sup> with 2 M-class flares; the 24h with four flares, the largest an M4.4 at 0328UTC; and the 28<sup>th</sup>, with one M1.3 flare.

Geomagnetic activity in the Australian region reached G1 level on the 24<sup>th</sup>, and at some Australian sites for brief periods on the 25<sup>th</sup>, remaining below warning threshold otherwise. A weak geomagnetic impulse of 26 nanoTesla was observed at 2041UTC on the 24<sup>th</sup>.

F2 critical frequencies in Southern Australia saw enhancement of 20% after local dawn on the 23<sup>rd</sup>; the 25<sup>th</sup> saw enhancement of 45% just after local dawn, quickly dropping into depression of 15% during local day, but recovering to near predicted at night. The 26<sup>th</sup> saw enhancement of 20% during local night; and the 28<sup>th</sup> saw enhancement of 20% at local dawn.

The forecast, issued on the 29<sup>th</sup> of September, through until the 5<sup>th</sup> of October:

Solar activity is expected to be at R0 to R1 with a slight chance of R2 activity.

Geomagnetic activity may reach G1 on the 29<sup>th</sup>; otherwise, activity should be at low to moderate levels.

Maximum usable frequencies may be enhanced up to 20% over predicted monthly values.

## Solar Flux Index update

Looking back to August, we had a;

Minimum of 139, Average of 156, and a Maximum of 177 With peak dates from the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 9<sup>th</sup>, and the 16<sup>th</sup> to the 17<sup>th</sup>

Having just finished September, we had a;

Minimum of 131, Average of 154, and a Maximum of 176 With peak dates from the 8<sup>th</sup> to the 12<sup>th</sup>, and the 19<sup>th</sup> to the 30<sup>th</sup>

And as we start October, we are expecting a;

Minimum of 143, Average of 155, and a Maximum of 168 With peak dates from the 7<sup>th</sup> to the 10<sup>th</sup>, and the 19<sup>th</sup> to the 28<sup>th</sup>.

Starting a busy month, WICEN had a meetup here at Dural this morning; the next one will be will be 5 November.

There will be a Cave Rescue exercise at Bungonia Caves, on 20th to 22nd. Four or five operators are required for this event. Radio operations will be above ground, but there will be the opportunity to enter the caves at the end.

On the same weekend, WICEN will be at the Murrumbateman Field Days, just south of Yass.

On 28th-29th, WICEN will provide safety communications for The Hawkesbury Canoe Classic, a canoe marathon that helps raise money to fund bone marrow transfer research. Operators are required to run about 25 checkpoint stations along the 111km course.

Using a VSWR meter to tune antennas, just shows total power being reflected; but, a VNA will display both the magnitude and phase of signals, showing the true impedance of a circuit. Members and visitors are encouraged to share their experience using a Vector Network Analyzer, and bring along your VNA project and demonstrate to others how a VNA can be a useful tool in the radio shack.

The gathering is at the first Kyle Bay Scout Hall at Donnelly Park; Kyle Parade Connells Point, near South Hurstville. By public transport, take the 953 bus from Hurstville station.
