Since 1957, amateur radio has been used by Scouts, and more recently Girl Guides, to get together virtually, from anywhere in the world, through Jamboree on the Air, or JOTA. Its on again this year, and its happening next weekend.

Starting on Friday the 20th and through until Sunday the 22nd of October, amateur air waves are thrown open to youthful voices with enthusiasm to make new friends and exchange experiences. Contacts are made with other JOTA stations in the next suburb, interstate or overseas.

As in previous years, subject to delivery VK2WI will relay the official opening address at 1pm on the afternoon of Saturday the 21st, on all VK2WI frequencies and through automated relays.

Solar activity was at R1 levels on the 7th, with an M1.7 solar flare; on the 10th, with an M1.6 at 0209UTC, and an M2.3 at 1217UTC; and on the 12th, with an M1.1 at 0458UTC.

Geomagnetic activity in the Australian region was mostly quiet, remaining below warning threshold.

F2 critical frequencies in Southern Australia were enhanced 25% on the 6th, 20% during local day on the 7th; 20% during local day and 30% during local night on the 8th; 25% during local night on the 9th; 30% during local night on the 10th; and 20% during local day and 25% during the night on the 11th.

The forecast, issued on the 13th of October, through until the 19th;

Solar activity is expected to be at R0 to R1, with a chance of R2 flares with returning active solar regions.

Geomagnetic activity is expected to be at low to moderate levels.

Maximum usable frequencies should be near predicted monthly values, up to 15% enhanced.

And looking ahead to November, we are expecting a;

Minimum of 148, Average of 155, and a Maximum of 160 With peak dates from the 1st to the 11th, and the 22nd to the 27th.

If your station can run Winlink, you might like to participate in Shakeout 2023, "the world's largest earthquake drill". The event happens on 19 October at 10.19am *your local time*. Participation involves sending a "Did You Feel It" report to the US Geological Survey, using Winlink. This takes only a couple of minutes, so it's quick and easy to do. The latest edition of WaveTalkers Live on YouTube discusses how to participate in the event. Links are in the text edition of WICEN News.

Next weekend WICEN will be active at the Bungonia Cave Rescue exercise near Goulburn, and the Murrumbateman Field Days, just south of Yass.

On 28th-29th, WICEN will provide safety communications for The Hawkesbury Canoe Classic, a canoe marathon that helps raise money to fund bone marrow transfer research. Operators are required to run checkpoint stations along the 111km course.

To participate in any WICEN event, or just find out more about how to use your Amateur Radio skills in times of need, you can email <u>wicen.ops@vrarescue.org</u>. If you're new to this, you can be paired with a more experienced WICEN member.

WICEN nets take place every Sunday evening, using FM voice, DMR, P25, or HF voice, depending on the week. All WICEN members and other Amateurs are welcome to join in.

Free Space Optics (FSO) uses light propagating in free space to wirelessly transmit data for telecommunications. "Free space" means air, outer space, vacuum, or something similar. This talk will highlight some of the engineering challenges, and how they were solved in a commercial laser communications product, the Centauri Laser Terminal from Transcelestial Technologies. The talk will also cover a next generation terminal currently in research; it will use FSO between ground stations on earth and a constellation of satellites in orbit, to enable high bandwidth, low latency communication to any location.

Next weekend is of course Jamboree on the Air, or JOTA! The Society will host visiting Scouts and Guides, introducing them to the joys of Amateur Radio. JOTA station VK2SNR will be active from the clubhouse Saturday. Hope to catch you on the air!
