Dural Update.

The 6 metre 52.525 FM broadcast transceiver went off air a few weeks ago. On subsequent investigation, it was found that there was a power supply problem, which has since been repaired and the unit put back into operation thanks to our Dural engineer, Mark VK2XOF.

A group of enthusiasts has offered to reinstate the 23 cm beacon at Dural. They are working on the project and hope to have it back up in the near future. This will involve the building and installation of a new antenna as well as some work on the transmitter.

Do You Know Your Directors?

Robert Keith ("Bob") Yorston – VK2CAN.

I was born at Chatswood in 1938, and have largely lived in that area – Willoughby – Artarmon – Roseville – Turramurra – Roseville – except when work has taken me elsewhere. I was educated at Artarmon and



North Sydney Boys' High. After that, I completed an accountancy course at the Australian Accountancy College – whilst working at Norton & Favielle. Eventually, this proved too much for me, and I drifted into Electronics – the Electronics & Communications Certificate at Gore Hill TAFE. Whilst doing this – and subsequently – I worked at AWA and Philips.

AWA – I started at Arts & Patents (47 York Street - Head Office) and continued at various sections of AWA – while instructing at Marconi School of Wireless – Amateur – Broadcast Operators' Certificate – Commercial Operators' Certificate (Marine) – all of which was from the mid-50's to the mid-80's.

Philips – Philips-Stanford – the medical division of Philips, then Philips Laboratories at Hendon and Hamburg.

Apart from the Instructing at Marconi, I was also involved with Moreshy

the Post & Telegraphs Department at Port Moresby.

Well – I've covered my early and working life. Now to Amateur Radio – I became an Associate Member of the NSW division of the WIA in the mid – 50's – before Aitchison Street, St Leonards was fully established – a lot of the meetings were in Science House in The Rocks. Eventually – work and family permitting – I became VK2CAN in the mid – 70's. Those of you who were Hams back in that era would be aware that "C" calls were mainly granted to the Armed Forces – which I was at the time – Garden Island – guided missiles. But after that, as I was employed at odd places - dealing with delicate instrumentation - like North-West Cape, Gove, Weipa and Boyne Island – still moving around – I was allowed to keep the "C" call. This meant that – wherever I was in Australia, I kept the VK2CAN callsign. With my many years on ARNSW Council, I kept the VK2CAN call, although heaps of 2-letter calls had passed my way (from S/K mates) – as I could see the confusion that using them caused amongst my elderly Ham mates.

My Amateur Radio gear covers from 160metres to 23cms – generally at an ERP of somewhat more than 100watts. As a result – when there's been a power failure or similar at Dural – I've "been invaded" for the duration of the broadcasts.
